Peaceful School block 5: we all make a contribution

We want the children to feel connected to the class and the school. That is only possible if we give children the feeling that they matter. To achieve this, the children receive tasks and responsibilities. Agreements have been made within the school about what the children can think and decide. If the children feel involved with the class and the school, it creates a positive atmosphere. They are then motivated to participate in what happens in class and experience that together you can achieve more than on your own. For groups 1 - 4, the lessons focus on, for example: - recognizing anger at yourself and the other. - learn how to deal with your anger. - make up again after a conflict. - learn to search for solutions to a conflict. - learn when something is helpful and when it is interfering - difference between helping in a conflict as a referee and helping as a mediator. - learn that you can ask student mediators at school to help when you have a conflict. The children are made aware of the difference between responsibility for your little sister and responsibility for the community, for example the class or the school. In groups 5 - 8 the children learn to make their own contribution to the group and to the school for example: - devising activities to make it more fun for everyone in the class and in the school. - learn the difference between carrying out assignments and coming up with and deciding for yourself about plans and activities that are good for the group. The children gain insight into democracy as a form of state and know the role of elections, Second Chamber and government in a democracy. They see the similarity between school rules and laws.
